- **DELIVERABLE 5**: Provide formal and recognized credit-bearing credentials for public service and workplace competencies
- DELIVERABLE 6: Expand industry-sector recognition and employment opportunities

MLK DAY OF SERVICE

The MLK Day of Service project reflects Engage NJ's innovative approach to community building. In the 2024-2025 grant cycle, 9,108 volunteers participated in 52 service projects nationally, collectively contributing an approximate 18,000 hours of service. Key impacts included around 200 bags of clothes recycled and donated, 2,000 bags of supplies for school children, and 10,000 meal-kits made for those in need worldwide.

Through partnerships with over 50 universities across 11 states, this initiative ensured that efforts were both inclusive and sustainable, reaching underserved communities in New Jersey, Pennsylvania, New York, Delaware, Maryland, Washington D.C., North Carolina, Indiana, Washington, Idaho, and California.

Beyond a single day, this project inspires year-round engagement. Surveys showed that an estimate of 2,000 students pledged to continue serving over the course of the year, demonstrating the ripple effect of this work. Engage NJ's leadership in mobilizing cross-state collaboration proves that Dr. King's dream thrives in collective action.

STUDENT PROGRAMMING - CONFERENCES, INTERNSHIPS, FELLOWSHIPS

THRIVE

Engage NJ's Thrive Conference 2025 brought together close to **150** students, nonprofit leaders, and professionals for a day of learning, collaboration, and inspiration. Held on February 26th at Middlesex College, this year's event centered on equipping attendees with tools to drive sustainable impact in their communities.

The conference featured **17 dynamic presentations** led by students with experience in volunteerism, civic engagement, nonprofit management, education, and much more. Attendees also participated in the Opportunity Fair, the portion of the event where students could engage with over **14 different nonprofit, business, and government organizations,** fostering meaningful connections across sectors. With **85% of surveyed participants** reporting they left with "actionable strategies" for their work, Thrive 2025 proved its role as a catalyst for change.

KESSELMAN FELLOWSHIPS

The Kesselman Student Fellowship is an initiative to empower teams of students to work on local community projects. The fellowships are so named to honor Dr. Harvey Kesselman, former president of Stockton University, long-serving board member of Engage NJ, and a staunch advocate and changeagent for the advancement of human rights across the Garden State.

This year, 4 groups of students were awarded \$1000 each to plan, enact, and gather data for their projects. The selected projects focus on animal welfare and urban environment stewardship, food knowledge and access, food insecurity and food bank patrons, and protests on college campuses.


